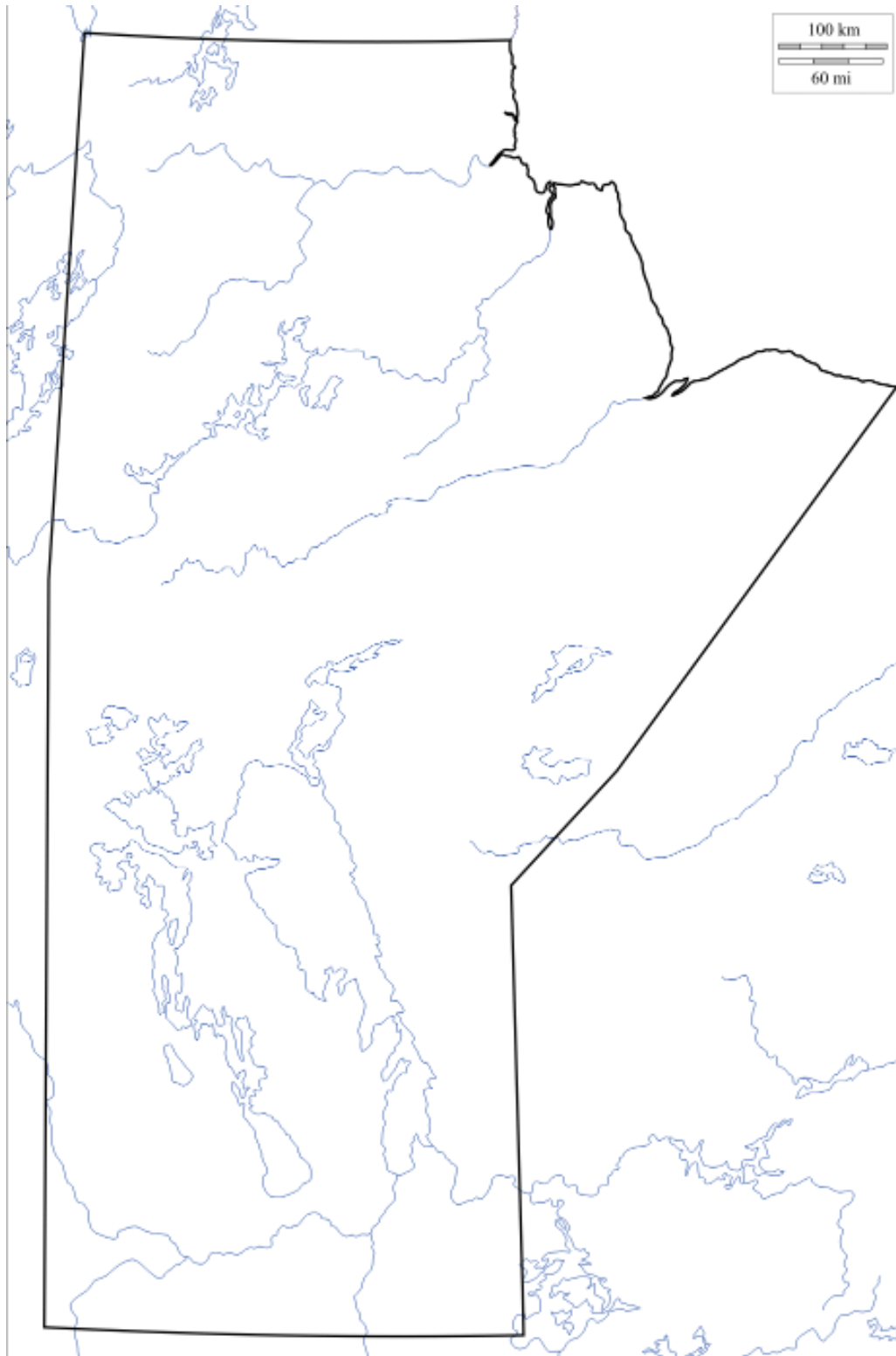

Follow the instructions as directed. Use complete sentences in response to questions.

Complete the following on the map of Manitoba:

1. Using an atlas, locate and indicate your school's community on the map. Mark it with a red dot. Write your community's name.
2. Using an atlas or the *Map of the Numbered Treaties* found on the TRCM's website at: <http://www.trcm.ca/treaties/treaties-in-manitoba/view-pdf-interactive-map-of-numbered-treaties-trcm-july-20-entry/>:
 - a) Draw the boundaries of the Numbered Treaties in Manitoba.
 - b) Using coloured pencils and a map key, indicate Treaties 1 to 5.
3. Locate and indicate with a blue dot two First Nations communities in each Treaty area. Make sure to name each community.
4. Locate and indicate Manitoba's capital city, Winnipeg on the map using a star. Write Winnipeg's name next to the star.

5. What Treaty area is your community in?
6. Describe the relative location of the Treaty area you live in (relative location refers to the position of a place in respect to other locations. For example, Winnipeg is north of the United States border; the Duck Mountains are in the western part of Manitoba; Nelson House is 75 km northwest of Thompson.)
7. What are the major physical features in your Treaty area (rivers, lakes, mountains, hills, plains, etc.)?



8. What are the nearest First Nation communities to your school? (If you are on a band-controlled school, what is the nearest towns/villages/cities?). List two.

9. List three other Canadian communities in your Treaty area.
