

- 10.** (2 words) A legal document from 1763 which established British ownership over all colonies in Canada and provided protection over unsettled lands belonging to the Indians.
- 11.** The customs, history, values and languages that make up the heritage of a person or people that contribute to an individual's or people's identity.

- 1.** (2 words) A term used to describe the art of passing on the history, values and beliefs of First Nations from one generation to the next through spoken words.
- 3.** A set of principles that guide conduct and behaviours as a means to demonstrate peace, harmony, mutual respect, understanding and good relations.
- 4.** (2 words) Canadian federal legislation first passed in 1876 that sets out certain federal government obligations and regulates the management of Indian reserve lands, Indian moneys, and other resources.
- 5.** A God-given right, existing in someone or something as a permanent characteristic or quality.
- 6.** (2 words) A term that came into common usage in the 1970s to replace the word "Indian", which some people found offensive.
- 7.** A term used to describe Euro-Canadian non-First Nations peoples.
- 8.** The monarch, especially as head of state; the power or authority residing in the monarchy.
- 9.** Solemn agreements between two or more nations that create mutually binding obligations.
